

Pupil Premium 2016-2017

In 2015-2016 pupil premium pupils made as good or greater than expected progress in the vast majority of cases, in reading and writing 63% made greater than expected progress and in maths 45% made greater than expected progress. This suggests that the pattern of spend adopted last year was successful in supporting these pupils and closing the gap between their attainment and that of other pupils. Consequently we will adopt a largely similar pattern of expenditure this year.

In the financial year 2016-2017 we have been allocated £15400. This will be spent as follows:

Free School Meals*

We are required to use pupil premium funding to pay for those pupil premium children who receive free school meals. Cost: £1000

Success criteria: ensuring children are properly fed will contribute towards them enjoying a healthy lifestyle and being ready to learn.

Breakfast Club*

We will use funds to fund places at the school's breakfast club. A significant number of pupils attending breakfast club are pupil premium children. Cost: £1000

Success criteria: ensuring children are properly fed will contribute towards them enjoying a healthy lifestyle and being ready to learn.

Participation in optional activities*

We will ensure that pupil premium children are able to attend in all trips and residential activities regardless of the cost by subsidising these activities for those children. This is in line with the governors' charging and remissions policy. Cost: £600

Success criteria: all children have access to exciting learning opportunities.

Intervention work ongoing

Support staff in all classes work with pupil premium children providing one to one tuition, group interventions and other support. This varies from term to term and is managed by teachers who keep a close eye on the work of those pupils. This cost has been broken down into two

elements: the initial ongoing allocation based on historical staff deployment plus an additional sum to allow changes and additional support to be allocated in year as and when needs arise. Cost: initial: £8972 additional: £3200

Success criteria: the gap in attainment between pupil premium children and other children is reduced; pupil premium children make greater progress than other children. Staff are able to deploy additional resource through the year to target needs that are identified.

Contingency

This sum allows for the purchase of resources that may be identified through the year. £600

*The take up on these activities will vary through the year and governors will monitor this carefully at termly meetings.

The Headteacher monitors the progress of pupil premium children through the year and reports on this to the governing body.
