### Sports Premium 2016-2017

Funding for the financial year 2016-2017 amounted to £8337

#### **Forest Schools**

We will continue with forest schools provision through the work of Badger Schools. This year as last, each class will enjoy half a term working with Forest School staff. This year we are trying to ensure that there is a closer link between what happens in forest schools and the pupil's topic work. Spend: £1500

Success criteria: Pupils use our grounds to be physically active and develop team work and social skills. Our grounds are used as an 'Outdoor Classroom'.

Outcomes: Pupils have continued to use the outdoor space to enjoy forest school throughout the year. Lessons and activities have been planned to facilitate team work and support each classes topic. Improved curriculum links have encouraged pupils to apply their outside learning in the classroom.

(Actual Spend: £2050.00)

Next Steps: Continue to build curriculum links and ensure that support staff develop confidence in outside learning.

## **Gymnastics**

Using The Callywith Centre for gymnastics last year was a real strength of our provision and meant that pupils benefited from high quality teaching in a purpose built environment. Without this our children would have no experience of gymnastics. Although this was costly we will ensure that all ks1 pupils enjoy this again and if possible give each ks2 class half a term of gymnastics too. Spend: £2400

Success criteria: school is able to provide a broad PE curriculum including gymnastics that engages and enriches pupils.

Outcomes: At the start of the financial year, we used the Callywith Centre to deliver Gymnastics to the pupils. This proved popular, we were able to build good links with the club and support staff observed how we could use our new indoor space to deliver 'floor activities'. Unfortunately, due to the unexpected closure of the Callywith Centre we had to explore other avenues. Initially we hoped to use 'Kernow Gymnastic', unfortunately we felt that the travelling time would be prohibitive as they are now based at Summercourt. (Actual Spend: £735.00)

Next Steps: Explore different ways to deliver Gymnastics, our indoor space could be suitable for floor work and KS1 but we need to find another solution for KS2. New links being made with other school groups and new management of the Dragon Leisure Centre could help us to provide an alternative space for KS2.

### **Supporting Competition and partnership work**

We will use sports premium money to support 3 areas of work for The Lanhydrock Schools' Partnership, of which we are proud members:

- Working with partner schools to enable gifted and talented dancers to perform at The Hall for Cornwall in early 2017. Use of this funding provides essential transport, tuition and supervision
- Working with partner schools to enter a swimming team in the annual Dragon Centre Gala. Last year trials were keenly contested and the team came second overall. Again funding provides transport and supervision.
- Working with partner schools to provide wonderful infants sports experience for children in the trust. Funding helped with supervision and refreshments.

Spend: £600

Success criteria: children in the trust learn to collaborate and to compete. They benefit from social interaction with a wider range of peers. They take part in high quality events that challenge them and give them opportunities to perform in front of a large audience.

Outcomes: This year we have successfully taken part in a variety of community events including football, orienteering, netball, dance, cross-country and swimming. We have used 'premium' money to provide transport and staff cover. This has given the pupils opportunities to work as a team, compete and to socialize with children from other schools. Due to additional training sessions and our fantastic children we came first, for the first time ever, in the Bodmin swimming Gala. This was not only fantastic for the pupils involved but created a sense of excitement throughout the school. We were also able to deliver a Key Stage 1 cross-partnership multi-skills event and this proved successful, enjoyable and strengthened school links. We were visited by musicians (including a Cornish Bard) and a community dance group and took part in a mass-Cornish dance in the middle of Bodmin. In addition, our Year 5 and 6 pupils took part in the 'Bike Lights Project' and our 'bike' was part of Wadebridge's Bikelights parade.

In this financial year:

93% of the current Year 1 pupils took part in an inter-school competition 100% of the current Year 2 pupils took part in two inter-school competition 100% of the current Year 3 pupils took part in at least one inter-school competition 100% of the current Year 4 pupils took part in at least one inter-school competition

100 % of the current Year 5 pupils took part in at least one inter-school competition 64 % of the current Year 6 pupils took part in at least one inter-school competition

(Actual Spend: £930.34)

Next Steps: Develop more after school clubs and encourage the involvement of parents in supporting us with this. Ensure that we build on this year's success in competitive events and take part in more inter school activities. Once established in our new school group, hold a Key stage 1 and a Key stage 2 cross-schools event.

# Making best use of our new indoor space for PE

Last year and this we will be updating our facilities to have some sort of space for indoor sports. The bulk of the spend on this was in the last financial year when the new classroom was built however we need additional resource to finish tidying the dining/spare space to maximize the space for sport.

We will in Spring 2017 engage the service of a dance teacher to work with the junior classes to see how well we can use the space for PE. This will add breadth to the PE curriculum for those children. Spend: £2000

Success criteria: children at the school are able to take part in a wide range of activities regardless of the weather. Children learn to move creatively, to respond to musical stimuli and to work together.

Outcomes: This year we have been supported by 'Dance Republic' and a specialist dance teacher in delivering dance to Key Stage 2. These sessions supported team work and enriched our curriculum as the dance sessions were linked to our topics. The 'new space' worked well for dance sessions and we were able to fully assess and overcome, with some alterations, health and safety implications such as the rooms dual purpose and the lack of head height.

The indoor space was utilised for Key Stage 1 multi-skills and movement sessions. The space worked well for 'smaller pupils' and we now have a usable indoor space!

(Actual Spend: Dance £701.25 Room development, improvements and safety: £5452.50)

Next Steps: To continue to develop the indoor space through the purchase of equipment to support the delivery of dance and gymnastics.

# **Activity at lunch times**

We will use some money to engage additional TA support at lunch time focused on involving pupils in games and other activities. Half an hour per day. Spend: £750 Success criteria: pupils are challenged to be more active at lunchtimes, more children are engaged in purposeful activities at lunch time.

Outcomes: Pupils have benefited from having an additional adult available at lunchtimes and pupils have enjoyed such activities as creating group dances and taking part in 'Wake-up, Shake-up' events.

Actual Spend: £532

Next Steps: Continue to develop the role of the TA and sports leaders. Mrs Teague will work with the TA in the Summer Term to further develop intra-school competition. As the School Council have just completed fundraising for a new Sports Shed and equipment, we will use the sense of ownership this has engendered to empower pupils and encourage them in sport leadership roles.

## Contingency

This allows us to respond to new initiatives and ideas through the year: Spend: £1087

Outcomes: We have spent more than predicted in many areas especially in the development of our indoor space. We have used the contingency and additional funds that were rolled over from the previous year. Total spend this year: £9699
