## Family Tree

Create a family tree showing the Tudor royal family.

## Research the Tudor

### Rose

## Food

Research Tudor foods and bring in a recipe (or a sample you've made it at home!).

## Learn a HH song

Choose a song from the programme Horrible Histories about one of the 'Terrible Tudors' and perform it to the class.

## Lute

Make a model of a Lute and bring it in to show the class. Tell us how you made it.

## Shakespeare
